

A new, larger Victorville City Library is currently under construction at the Green Tree Golf Course, which will offer increased programming to better meet the needs of the community. The city is adding 5,100 square feet to the former

Clubhouse building, thanks to a nine-million-dollar-competitive grant from the California State Librarian. The new Library will be double the size of the current Library, providing room for a children's library, makerspace, classrooms, dedicated teen space, adult sitting area by the fireplace, and an outdoor reading area on the patio. The new Victorville City

Library is anticipated to begin operations in early 2026.
